

Doug Cartier led a discussion on how to move a large mill by one person. He built a fixture to tilt a large CNC mill in order to transport and get it under his garage door.


Dennis Cranston led a discussion about the problems and quality differences between purchasing a used domestic and new offshore produced machine tool.
