

Recap of the 11 February 2023 General Meeting

Presentation

Club member Martin Kennedy gave a presentation on his recent visit, during 13 and 14 January, to the Cabin Fever Expo, Model Engineering Exposition, Lebanon Valley Expo Center, Lebanon, Pennsylvania, about 70 miles west of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Kennedy showed and described videos and pictures of the exhibits during his two day visit. There were six areas of the exposition, namely: engines of many types, boats, live steam trains, radio controlled equipment, vendor sales, and consignment sales. There was an auction of books, equipment, and tools. Admission to the expo was \$15.00 for both days.

The Lebanon Valley Exposition Center has over 75,000 square feet of indoor exhibition space with plenty of parking for visitors. The following videos were shown during the presentation.

Model Engines (duration 10 minutes 33 seconds)

Radio Control (duration 4 minutes 14 seconds)

Boats (duration 1 minute 19 seconds)

Problems and Solutions

A participant has an ongoing problem trying to mate a dividing head with an adapter. So far, he has determined the pitch diameter is different between the two parts. Several suggestions were offered to make the pitch diameters the same.

Another participant sought recommendations on the best way to restore a power washer that had a seized 4-cycle engine. Several suggestions were offered.
